

Melissa Hatter, CNM, PMH-C, MSN, RN, was inducted as a Fellow of the American College of Nurse-Midwives (FACNM) in May 2024. This Fellowship is an honor recognizing midwives for demonstrated leadership within ACNM, clinical excellence, outstanding scholarship, and professional achievement. Members of the Fellowship serve ACNM in a consultative and advisory capacity.

#### Katherine Britt, PhD, RN

Katherine Britt, PhD, RN, from the University of Pennsylvania, was selected as a 2024 Butler-Williams Scholar by the National Institute of Aging. The Butler-Williams Scholars program provides opportunities for emerging researchers to explore topics such as the biology of aging, genetics and Alzheimer's disease, health behaviors, and health disparities in aging. Participants also receive support and consultation for their research agendas.

#### Kelly Pretorius, PhD, MPH, APRN, CPNP-A/C&PC, RN

Kelly Pretorius, PhD, MPH, APRN, CPNP-A/C&PC, RN, an Assistant Professor at St. Edward's University, received a \$100,000 grant for her project, *A Mixed Methods Approach to Exploring Firearm-Owning Parents' Perspectives and Influences Regarding Firearm Safety*. Funded by the Pediatric Pandemic Network's Pilot and Emerging Issues Program under the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, her research will be conducted at Texas Children's Hospital, where she also practices as a Pediatric Nurse Practitioner in Pediatric Hospital Medicine.

# **Southern Nursing Research Society Members Honored** with Betty Irene Moore Fellowships

Four members of the Southern Nursing Research Society (SNRS) have been awarded the prestigious Betty Irene Moore Fellowship from the University of California, Davis. Stacey Crane, Gaea Daniel, Blake McGee, and Danielle Sarik are among 16 nurse scientists selected for the 2024 cohort.

### **Stacey Crane, PhD, RN, CPON**

Stacey Crane, PhD, RN, CPON, an assistant professor at the Cizik School of Nursing at UTHealth Houston, will focus her fellowship on *Advancing Comprehensive Symptom Assessments for Children with Cancer*. A pediatric oncology nurse with 13 years of experience, Dr. Crane's work aims to incorporate patient-reported outcome tools into clinical practice to improve cancer care for children. She holds a PhD in nursing science and a graduate certificate in bioethics from Indiana University School of Nursing, and an MSN in informatics.

#### Gaea A. Daniel, PhD, RN

Gaea A. Daniel, PhD, RN, an assistant professor at Emory University's Nell Hodgson Woodruff School of

Nursing, is developing a nurse-led model for a mobile sexual health clinic. Her project explores sociocultural and environmental influences on sexual health outcomes, with a focus on addressing disparities in Black women. Dr. Daniel earned her PhD from Emory University, an MSN from Augusta University, and a Bachelor of Liberal Studies from Mercer University.

#### Blake McGee, PhD, RN, MPH

Blake McGee, PhD, RN, MPH, an associate professor at Georgia State University School of Nursing, will advance his research project, *Understanding Medicaid Expansion Alternatives and Maximizing Coverage for Low-Income Working People*. Dr. McGee specializes in health policy and optimizing healthcare coverage for marginalized populations. He holds a PhD and a BSN from Emory University and an MPH from Columbia University.
