



[SNRS Call for Pre-conference Workshops](#)

Deadline: August 31, 2018

Goal: To provide pre-conference sessions at the Annual Conference that provides educational opportunities in research for SNRS members and doctoral student members.

Pre-conference sessions will be held the morning of the first conference day, Wednesday, February 27 (8am-11am) prior to the start of Annual Conference sessions. Pre-conference sessions will be held only if registration numbers (paid registration, at least 10 paid registrations) meet the budget requirements for the session.

Pre-conference sessions will be held in a workshop format. Work-shop topics may include research designs, methods, dissemination strategies (e.g., publishing) or other topics approved by the Program Committee and Board. Pre-conference Workshop Speakers will not receive payment for these sessions.

Pre-conference workshop proposals should include:

1. Title
2. Educational objectives
3. Content outline
4. AV requirements
5. Projected number of attendees

Room set-up and AV information: Pre-conference rooms are set up classroom style with tables and chairs for participants to work at. There is a head table with wired mics, at the front of the room, and a podium with a mic, a laptop and a projector.

AUTHORS: Please enter all authors exactly as they should appear in the on-site program and on the website should your pre-conference be accepted.

DEADLINE: The submission portal will close on Friday, August 31, 2018 at 5 PM (Central Daylight time). No further revisions can be made after that time.
